

FOREWORD

The Reserve Bank of India regularly brings out the Report on Currency and Finance, which was traditionally considered as a comprehensive source and record of economic developments. The structure of this Report has been re-oriented since 1998-99 from just documenting the economic developments to a 'theme-based report'. 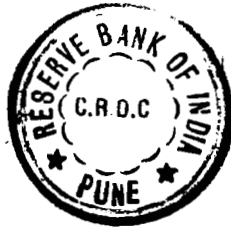

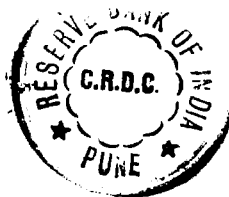

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NOTES ON THE STATEMENTS

In the Statistical Statements presented in this volume, annual data are generally given for the financial years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1969-70 to 1974-75 ; thus the data for 1974-75 refer to the year from April 1, 1974 to March 31, 1975. However, the statements on Industrial Production and Capital raised by Non-Government and Government Companies are presented on calendar year basis, as the statistics compiled by the respective sources are on that basis. Further, data relating to (i) Agricultural Production, (ii) Financial Assistance Sanctioned by the Industrial Finance Corporation of India, (iii) Industrial Development Bank of India—Amount Sanctioned and Cash Disbursed, (iv) Agricultural Refinance Corporation and (v) Unit Trust of India are for the year ended June. In respect of Liabilities and Assets of the Industrial Development Bank of India, data are presented as at the end of June.

The statement on "Economic Classification of Population Census 1971" is replaced with a new statement on "Estimated Mid-Year Population, 1961-1981." The statements newly included are (i) Currency chests/Repositories (Sub-chests) and Small coin depots/Sub-depots as at the end of March 1975 and (ii) Net Issue (+)/Withdrawal (—) of Bank Notes as at the end of March 1975—By Centre.

The Indian Rupee was devalued on June 6, 1966 changing its par value from Rs. 4.76 per U.S. Dollar to Rs. 7.50 per U.S. Dollar and from Rs. 13.33 per Pound Sterling to Rs. 21.00 per Pound Sterling. On devaluation of the Pound Sterling on November 18, 1971, the exchange value of the rupee in terms of Sterling changed to Rs. 18.00 per Pound Sterling. On December 20, 1971, India established a central rate for the rupee at Rs. 18.9677 per Pound Sterling. Effective September 25, 1975, the exchange value of the rupee is determined with reference to daily exchange rate movements of selected currencies of those countries which are India's major trading partners, with the mid-point of the Reserve Bank's buying and selling rates for spot Sterling at Rs. 18.3084 per Pound Sterling, the Pound Sterling continuing to remain as India's intervention currency.

From November 1, 1956 (on which date the States Reorganisation Act, 1956, became effective) to April 30, 1960, the Indian Union consisted of fourteen states and a few centrally administered areas. The erstwhile Bombay State was bifurcated on May 1, 1960 into (i) Maharashtra and (ii) Gujarat. On December 1, 1963, Nagaland was constituted as a new State and on November 1, 1966 another new State *viz.* Haryana was formed. On April 2, 1970, State of Meghalaya was constituted ; till then it formed a part of the State of Assam. On January 25, 1971, Himachal Pradesh and on January 21, 1972, two new States of Manipur and Tripura came into existence. The Adaption of Sikkim Laws (No. 1) Order, 1975 came into force with effect from April 26, 1975. At present the number of States in Indian Union is twenty-two. The Federal Government is the Government of India, also called the Central Government.

Wherever necessary, each figure has been rounded off to the nearest final digit. For this reason, in some statements the constituent items may not exactly add up to the total.

The following symbols have been used :

- .. = Figure is not available.
- = Figure is nil or negligible.

A line drawn between the figures of two consecutive rows/columns indicates that the figures given after the line are not comparable with the preceding figures.

1 lakh = 100,000 ; 10 lakhs = 1 million and 1 crore = 10 millions.

The statistical data presented in the statements have been supplemented, wherever necessary, with suitable foot-notes to explain the limitations, coverage, etc. In addition, detailed explanatory notes on certain statements are given below :

Statement 18 :

For 1965-66 and 1969-70, the figures relating to gold are inclusive of gold received against

National Defence Fund and National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980. For 1965-66, the figures also include gold received against 7 per cent Gold Bonds, 1977 and 1980. From 1970-71 onwards the figures are inclusive of gold from following gold accounts : Surplus Gold Stock Account, Gold held at I.M.F. rate (confiscated gold received from State Governments, etc.), Confiscated gold received from Customs and Central Excise authorities, National Defence Fund Gold Stock Account, Indian (Bharat) Mines Gold Stock Account, Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account, Gold received from Hutti Gold Mines and Gold received from public for refining.

The figures of Silver melting and assaying are inclusive of Silver from Surplus Silver Stock Account, Confiscated Silver received from the Customs and Central Excise authorities, Silver received from State Governments and Judicial authorities, Silver pertaining to the National Defence Fund and Silver received from private parties, etc.

Statement 19 :

Spot prices of Gold relate to Gold Bullion upto August 27, 1963, 14-Carat Gold upto November 9, 1966 and to Standard Gold from July 10, 1967. Dealer to dealer quotations are not available for Gold since June 23, 1963.

Spot prices of Silver relate to below 0.996 fineness.

Forward trading in gold was banned throughout the country with effect from November 14, 1962 and that in silver, from January 10, 1963.

Statement 26 :

The item 'Other liabilities' includes :

- i) paid-up capital of Rs. 5 crores, and
- ii) reserve fund of Rs. 80 crores upto January 31, 1969 and Rs. 150 crores thereafter, the increase representing mainly the profit on revaluation of the Bank's gold stocks, effected from February 1, 1969 in terms of the amendment to Section 33(4) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934.

Also included in 'Other liabilities' are the balances as on various dates in (a) National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.A.C. (L.T.O.) Fund], (b) National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund [N.A.C. (Stab.) Fund] and (c) National Industrial Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.I.C. (L.T.O.) Fund], the details of which are given below :

Statement 28 :

Consequent on the merger of the Refinance Corporation for Industry with Industrial Development Bank of India as from September 1, 1964, the shares of the paid-up value of Rs. 100 lakhs, held by the Reserve Bank of India, have been paid for and taken up by the Industrial Development Bank of India.

Outstandings in respect of short-term finance to Industrial Finance Corporation under Section 17(4B) (a) and to Industrial Development Bank of India under Section 17(4H) (a) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 are 'nil.'

Statement 38 :

- (a) The Reserve Bank of India rate (Bank Rate) was raised from 4 per cent to 4.5 per cent on January 3, 1963, to 5 per cent on September 26, 1964, to 6 per cent on February 17, 1965, was lowered to 5 per cent on March 3, 1968, was raised to 6 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 7 per cent on May 31, 1973 and to 9 per cent from July 23, 1974.

- (b) Treasury bill rate of discount for sales on tap was 3.50 per cent per annum from July 16, 1965 to March 2, 1968. It was lowered to 3.00 per cent from March 4, 1968, raised to 3.50 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 4.00 per cent from June 1, 1973, to 4.25 per cent from April 1, 1974 and to 4.60 per cent from July 23, 1974.
- (c) The call money rates are the weighted averages of the quotations, the weights being proportional to the amounts accepted during the period.
- (d) The Bazar bill rate is the rate at which bills of small traders are reported to have been discounted by Shroffs. These are unofficial quotations.
- (e) Deposits rates are for major banks having demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores and above and for foreign banks. These rates were based on Inter-Bank Agreement upto September 1964 and on the Reserve Bank directives thereafter.
- (f) With effect from February 1, 1975, the smaller banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores are allowed to pay 0.25 per cent higher on their term deposits with maturity of 5 years and less. For savings deposits, the rate will be 5.25 per cent for banks with liabilities of Rs. 10—25 crores and 5.50 per cent for banks with liabilities of less than Rs. 10 crores.
- (g) A ceiling of 9 per cent was imposed on the lending rates of the Indian scheduled banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores or above and all the foreign scheduled banks with effect from September 25, 1964; the rate was raised to 10 per cent from February 17, 1965, but reduced to 9.50 per cent from March 2, 1968. Since January 21, 1970, the ceiling on the lending rates was withdrawn.

Statement 40 :

Under the Credit Guarantee Scheme, which is administered by the Reserve Bank of India as an agent of the Central Government, all receipts by way of guarantee fees, recoveries in claim paid accounts, etc., less all payments

by way of claims are transmitted to Government as at the end of June and December each year. The net surplus with the Government represents the net amount (cumulative) transferred to Government. The entire administrative expenditure of the Guarantee Organisation is borne by the Reserve Bank of India.

Under the Scheme, as modified from 1st February 1970 (when the number of Guarantees outstanding was 92,755) and in terms of the agreement between the bank/financial institution and the Guarantee Organisation, all eligible credit facilities to small-scale units are deemed as covered and the issue of Guarantee certificates in respect of individual credit facilities having been dispensed with, they are required to file quarterly returns reporting such eligible credit facilities. The number of guarantees outstanding from March 1970 relates to number of entries reported in the quarterly statement.

Advances under default :

As soon as a default occurs in an account, the credit institution is required to report it to the Guarantee Organisation and the guarantee may be invoked any time thereafter. Such accounts, therefore, are potential claims.

Statement 41 :

Debt : Comprises (1) all borrowings from Government and semi-Government, Statutory Financial Corporations and other institutional agencies, (2) borrowings from banks against (i) other mortgages and (ii) own debentures for 1650 companies and (3) "Other borrowings" against own debentures and other mortgages and also deferred payment liabilities.

Equity is same as *Net worth*, explained in the Statement.

Current assets : Comprise (1) inventories, (2) loans and advances and other debtor balances, (3) investments in securities other than shares and debentures of subsidiary companies for 1501 companies/book value of quoted investments for 1650 companies, (4) cash and bank balances and (5) advance of income-tax in excess of tax-provision.

Current liabilities : Comprise (1) tax provisions in excess of advance of income-tax and other current provisions, (2) borrowings less debt as defined above and (3) trade dues and other current liabilities.

Statements 62 to 64 :

Figures of receipts and disbursements given in Statements 62 to 64 are not comparable with those given in the Reports on Currency and Finance published prior to 1973-74 due to changes in the accounting classification of the Budget. Please refer to Chapter V on "Budgets and Public Debt" of the Report on Currency and Finance for 1973-74 for a brief discussion on the new classification.

Statement 64 :

The figures of total revenue and expenditure as given in this statement differ from those in the Budget papers as receipts from forests, opium, currency and mint, electricity, etc., are shown on a net basis and States' share of Union excise duties and additional duties of excise are excluded. Owing to changes in accounting classification, the figures from 1962-63, particularly in respect of interest receipts, development expenditure and grants to States and Union Territory Governments under revenue accounts, are not strictly comparable with those for the earlier years. From 1971-72, irrigation (non-commercial) is shown on a gross basis. Budget estimates for 1975-76 relate to those presented to the Lok Sabha.

From 1957-58 the figures include self-balancing items in respect of grants under PL 480 and Steel Equalisation Funds. From 1962-63 figures also include Emergency Risks (Goods and Factories) Insurance Funds.

In the new accounting classification of the Budget introduced from 1974-75 onwards, a major change relates to the expenditure on food subsidy, famine relief and natural calamities. The expenditure on these items was earlier included under the head 'Other Expenditure' as part of the non-developmental expenditure. In the new classification it is included under the head 'Agricultural and allied services' as part of economic services under developmental expenditure. In this Statement, these data are covered according

to the new classification since the Report on Currency and Finance for 1973-74.

Statement 70 :

Outstanding balances of debt and other liabilities of Government of India as presented in this Statement differ from those published in earlier Currency Reports. The difference is partly due to the changes in sources of data, but is mainly on account of inclusion of some heads in the Statement which were formerly not covered.

Statements published in earlier Reports were compiled from three different sources. For some of the years, outstanding balances were derived from Finance Accounts of Government of India, for a few others from Combined Finance and Revenue Accounts of the Central and State Governments in India and for the rest, from the Explanatory Memoranda of Central Government budgets. For the sake of uniformity and comparability, the present Statement has been based on Finance Accounts of Union Government except for the latest two years for which these are not available. End-March 1975 and 1976 balances are based on the Explanatory Memorandum to the Central Government Budget, 1975-76.

The difference between the present Statement and the earlier ones is mainly under 'Reserve Funds and Deposits', outstanding balances against which are uniformly higher than the corresponding balances in the earlier Statements. The difference is mainly due to the inclusion, under this item, of balances at credit of Reserve Funds (not bearing interest); these balances were not covered earlier.

The upward revision in balances outstanding against 'Reserve Funds and Deposits' has raised the outstanding balances against 'Total Internal Debt and Other Liabilities' (Column 15) and 'Aggregate Liabilities' (Column 17).

Statement 72 :

The statement excludes :

(i) for 1965-66 and 1966-67, the contribution in respect of the National Defence Gold

Bonds, 1980 (A and B series) (the contributions to these bonds which were on sale between October 1965 and May 1966 were received in the form of gold),

(ii) 4½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1979, 5½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1999 and 4½ per cent Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds 1981,

(iii) *issues and repayments of*: 2½ per cent U. P. Zamindari Abolition Compensation Bonds, U. P. Zamindari Abolition Rehabilitation Grant Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Jagir Resumption Compensation and Rehabilitation Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Zamindari and Biswedari Abolition Compensation Bonds, 2½ per cent Rajasthan Jagir Resumption Compensation and Additional Rehabilitation Bonds, 2½ per cent Bihar Zamindari Abolition Compensation Bonds, 3 per cent Maharashtra Agricultural Land (Ceiling on Holdings) Act 1961 Compensation Bonds (Repayable in Instalments), Jenmikaram Payment (Abolition) Bonds, Tamil Nadu Land Reforms (Fixation of Ceiling on Land) Act, 1961 Compensation Bonds, 3 per cent Bombay Land Tenure Abolition Acts Compensation Bonds (Former Bombay, Maharashtra, Gujarat and Mysore), 3 per cent Maharashtra Revenue Patels (Abolition of Office) Act, 1962 Compensation Bonds, 4¼ per cent Kerala House Sites and Houses for Families of Landless Workers (Compensation for value of lands) Bonds and 4½ per cent Kerala House Sites and Houses for Families of Landless Workers (Compensation for value of lands) Bonds,

and *only issues of*: West Bengal Estates Acquisition Compensation Bonds, and 3 per cent Maharashtra Agricultural Land (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961 Compensation Bonds (Redeemable on Maturity),

and *only repayments of*: 3¼ per cent U. P. Encumbered Estates Act Bonds and 2¼ per cent Mysore Inams Abolition Compensation Bonds.

During 1974-75, the total issues and repayments of these bonds amounted to Rs. 504 lakhs and Rs. 408 lakhs respectively, issues and repayments of Assam State Acquisition

of Zamindari Act 1951 Compensation Bonds and 3 per cent Hyderabad (Abolition of Cash Grants) Act, 1952 Compensation Bonds were nil,

(iv) Rs. 100 crores of *ad hoc* Treasury Bills funded in January 1975 and

(v) Repayments of 3½ per cent Ten-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates, 4 per cent Ten-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates, 4½ per cent Ten-Year Defence Deposit Certificates, 15-Year Annuity Certificates-second series, Premium Prize Bonds, 1963, 5-Year Interest free Prize Bonds, 1965, Premium Prize Bonds, 1964 and Government of India Defence Certificates amounting to Rs. 1829 lakhs during 1974-75.

Statement 74 :

The statement includes (i) Hyderabad Loans upto 1974, (ii) 5-Year Interest free Prize Bonds (issued from April 1960) upto 1965, (iii) Premium Prize Bonds, 1963 (issued from January 1963) upto 1968 and Premium Prize Bonds, 1964 (issued from January 1964) upto 1969, (iv) 7 per cent (6½ per cent prior to April 1, 1965) Gold Bonds, 1977 issued from November 12, 1962, (v) 7 per cent Gold Bonds, 1980 issued from March 2, 1965, (vi) National Defence Gold Bonds, 1980 (A and B series) from 1967-68, the total contributions being 82,35,209 gms. and 47,47,914 gms. respectively of gold for the two series. The value of these amounts to Rs. 441 lakhs and Rs. 254 lakhs, respectively, at the rate of Rs. 53.58 per 10 gms. and (vii) 4½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1979, 5½ per cent Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds, 1999 and 4½ per cent Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds, 1981.

Statement 75 :

State debt has been reclassified as recommended in the second report of the Team on Reforms in the Structure of Budget and Accounts. Outstanding debt liabilities from March 31, 1973 onwards presented in this Statement are, therefore, not strictly comparable, item by item, with those for earlier period.

Total debt of State Governments used to be classified earlier under the following heads :

(i) Permanent Debt, (ii) Floating Debt, (iii) Loans from the Centre, (iv) Other Debt and (v) Unfunded Debt. Under the new classification the major heads are :

(i) Internal Debt, (ii) Loans and Advances from the Central Government and (iii) Provident Funds, etc. Points relating to comparability between the two classifications, are explained below :

I (a) Market loans and bonds—Comprises current and expired loans floated on the market and bonds issued in connection with abolition of Zamindari and Jagirdari and housing bonds, etc. This item is identical with 'Permanent Debt' as per the old classification.

I (b) Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India—Represents ways and means advances and overdrafts (repayable within seven days) from the Reserve Bank of India. This item corresponds to 'Floating Debt' of the earlier classification except that cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks which are included in the floating debt so far, are excluded from the new classification. Figures in the Statement against this item upto March 31, 1972 represent balances outstanding against 'Floating Debt' of the old classification and are thus not strictly comparable with balances outstanding subsequently.

I (c) Loans from Banks and Other Institutions—Covers loans from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund of the Reserve Bank of India, National Co-operative Development Corporation, Life Insurance Corporation of India, Employees' State Insurance Corporation, Khadi and Village Industries Commission, etc. The item corresponds to 'Other Debt' of the earlier classification except that it now includes cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks which were not included in 'Other Debt'. Figures against this item upto March 31, 1972 represent balances outstanding against 'Other Debt' under the old classification and are, therefore, not strictly comparable with balances outstanding subsequently.

II. Loans and Advances from the Central Government—Comprises loans and advances from the Central Government for plan as well as non-plan purposes including loans against small savings collections. The item is identical with the earlier item, 'Loans from the Centre'.

III. Provident Funds, etc.—Includes State Provident Funds, Insurance and Pension Funds, Trusts and Endowments, etc. and is identical with 'Unfunded Debt' of the old classification.

Statement 77 :

Survey of ownership pattern of the rupee debt of Central and State Government securities was being conducted on an annual basis till 1971. The survey has now been placed on an *ad hoc* basis and the latest survey on hand relates to March 31, 1974. Ownership pattern during the intervening years, i.e., 1972 and 1973, has been worked out from sources other than the survey returns. Thus, while holdings of State Governments, Reserve Bank of India (Own account) and commercial banks are based on records and surveys of the Reserve Bank of India, those of other categories such as Life Insurance Corporation of India, Coal Mines Provident Fund Scheme, Assam Tea Plantations Provident Fund Scheme, Employees' Provident Fund Scheme and provident funds of exempted establishments, are derived from the annual reports of the respective institutions. The major category of holders of Government securities not included in 1972 and 1973 position, is co-operative banks.

Statement 78 :

(1) *Outstandings* include Indian Union's Share of pre-partition liabilities and *Repayments* include those from the pre-partition holdings of Indian investors.

(2) Some details of 'Uncurrent series' are given below :

5-Year Fixed Deposits :

This scheme, introduced from March 15, 1968, has been discontinued since August 1, 1971. The figures exclude outstandings in

respect of '5-year Fixed Deposits—Banks' for which data are not available from September 1971 onwards.

15-Year Annuity Certificates :

The data relate to 'First series' issued from July 1954 to December 1957 and to 'Second series' issued from January 1958. The Certificates securing monthly payment of Rs. 10 were introduced from January 2, 1960. The series have been discontinued from September 1, 1971. Outstandings include all the series.

Post Office Cash and Defence Savings Certificates :

Include Defence Savings Bank Deposits upto 1954-55.

12-Year and 7-Year National Savings Certificates :

Discontinued with effect from May 30, 1957.

5-Year National Savings Certificates :

Discontinued with effect from July 1, 1953.

3½ Per cent 10-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates :

Issued from February 1, 1951 to May 31, 1957.

4 Per cent 10-Year Treasury Savings Deposit Certificates :

Issued from June 1, 1957 and discontinued from November 10, 1962.

10-Year National Plan Certificates :

Issued from May 10, 1954 to May 30, 1957.

12-Year National Plan Savings Certificates :

Issued from June 1, 1957 and discontinued from November 15, 1962.

Statement 80 :

Average rate of discount for auction sales of Government of India treasury bills (per cent per annum) relates to rate of discount for sales on tap from the week ended July 16,

1965. The rate of discount was 3.50 per cent per annum from July 16, 1965 to March 2, 1968, 3.00 per cent from March 4, 1968 to January 8, 1971, 3.50 per cent from January 9, 1971 to May 31, 1973, 4.00 per cent from June 1, 1973, 4.25 per cent from April 1, 1974 and 4.60 per cent from July 23, 1974.

Statements 83 to 86 :

The foreign trade data relate to total sea, air and land trade, on private and Government accounts. With effect from April 1963, trade of Goa, Daman and Diu as well as Andaman and Nicobar Islands, land-borne trade with Nepal and exports by parcel-post of pearls and precious stones are included. Direct transit trade, transshipment trade, ships' stores and passengers' baggage are excluded. Data include silver (other than current coins) notes and coins withdrawn from circulation or not yet issued, indirect transit trade and trade by parcel-post. Exports include re-exports and exports by letter-post. Imports include dutiable articles by letter-post and defence stores and exclude certain consignments of foodgrains and stores on Government account awaiting adjustment. From April 1965, data are based on the Revised Indian Trade Classification (with amendments upto April 1972) except in the case of imports of (i) "Prescribed substances" under the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 and (ii) "Petroleum and Petroleum Products".
