

FOREWORD

NOTES ON THE STATEMENTS

In the Statistical Statements presented in this volume, annual data are generally given for the financial years 1970-71 to 1976-77. Thus the data for 1976-77 refer to the year from April 1, 1976 to March 31, 1977. However, the statements on (i) Industrial Production, (ii) Capital raised by non-Government and Government Companies, (iii) Estimated Employment in Public and Private Sectors, (iv) Employment in Public and Private Sectors in Major Industries and Services, (v) Number of Applicants on Live Register of Employment Exchanges and (vi) Domestic Production and Imports of Crude Oil and Petroleum Products are presented on calendar year basis, as the statistics compiled by the respective sources are on that basis. Further, data relating to (i) Agricultural Production, (ii) Financial Assistance Sanctioned by the Industrial Finance Corporation of India, (iii) Industrial Development Bank of India, (iv) Agricultural Refinance and Development Corporation, (v) Unit Trust of India, (vi) Consumer Price Index Numbers for Agricultural Labourers and (vii) Credit Guarantee Scheme for Small-scale Industries are for the year ended June.

Several new statements have been introduced in this volume. They are (i) Share of Public Sector in Domestic Product, (ii) Number of Applicants on Live Register of Employment Exchanges, (iii) Estimated Employment in Public and Private Sectors, (iv) Employment in Public and Private Sectors in Major Industries and Services, (v) Domestic Production and Imports of Crude Oil and Petroleum Products, (vi) Remittances through the Reserve Bank of India—Telegraphic Transfers—Issued and Paid, (vii) Project Cost of Companies Issuing Capital, (viii) Financing of the Project Cost of Companies Issuing Capital, (ix) Pattern of Absorption of Capital Issues and (x) Outstandings under Compulsory Deposit Scheme. The three statements on Money Supply with the public have been re-

placed by five statements renamed 'Money Stock Measures (new series)' and compiled as per the recommendations of the Second Working Group on the subject, set up by the Bank.

The Indian Rupee was devalued on June 6, 1966, changing its par value from Rs. 4.76 to Rs. 7.50 per U.S. Dollar and from Rs. 13.33 to Rs. 21.00 per Pound Sterling. On devaluation of the Pound Sterling on November 18, 1967, the exchange value of the rupee in terms of Sterling changed to Rs. 18.00 per Pound Sterling. On December 20, 1971, India established a central rate for the rupee at Rs. 18.9677 per Pound Sterling. Effective September 25, 1975, the exchange rate of the rupee is determined on the basis of a basket of currencies of countries which are India's major trading partners, severing the earlier link with the Pound Sterling which still continues to remain India's intervention currency. Accordingly, the following revisions were effected in the rupee's exchange rate vis-a-vis the Pound Sterling.

From November 1, 1956 (on which date the States Reorganisation Act, 1956, became effective) to April 30, 1960, the Indian Union consisted of fourteen states and a few centrally administered areas. The erstwhile Bombay State was bifurcated on May 1, 1960, into (i) Maharashtra and (ii) Gujarat. On December 1, 1963, Nagaland was constituted as a new State and on November 1, 1966, another new State viz., Haryana was formed. On April 2, 1970, State of Megha-

laya was constituted; till then it formed a part of the State of Assam. On January 25, 1971, Himachal Pradesh and on January 21, 1972, two new States of Manipur and Tripura came into existence. The Adaptation of Sikkim Laws (No. 1) Order, 1975, came into force with effect from April 26, 1975. At present the number of States in Indian Union is twentytwo. The Federal Government is the Government of India, also called the Central Government.

Wherever necessary, each figure has been rounded off to the nearest final digit. For this reason, in some statements the constituent items may not exactly add up to the total.

The following symbols have been used:

.. = Figure is not available.

— = Figure is nil or negligible.

A line drawn between two consecutive rows/columns of figures indicates that the figures given after the line are not comparable with those preceding it.

1 lakh = 100,000; 10 lakhs = 1 million and 1 crore = 10 millions.

The statistical data presented in the statements have been supplemented, wherever necessary, with suitable foot-notes to explain the coverage, limitations, etc. More detailed explanatory notes on certain statements are given below :

Statement 8 :

Administrative departments comprise all governmental agencies whether Central, State or Local.

Departmental enterprises are unincorporated enterprises. The activities cover posts and telegraphs, government railways, irrigation and multipurpose river schemes, electricity schemes, port trusts, road transport undertakings, etc.

Non-departmental enterprises comprise (i) government companies and (ii) statutory corporations.

Statements 25 to 29 :

The revised series of Money Supply with the public have a wider coverage than the old series. Money Supply with the public (which is called M_1) has 3 components *viz.*, (a) currency with the public, (b) demand deposits and (c) other deposits with RBI. Currency with the public is arrived at by deducting from total currency, the currency returned by Pakistan and cash on hand with commercial banks, State, Central and Urban Co-operative Banks and Salary Earners' Societies.

M_2 would consist of M_1 plus net Post Office Savings Bank deposits. M_3 would comprise M_1 and net time deposits with commercial banks and the co-operative banks as in the case of net demand deposits. M_4 series include M_2 and total post office deposits.

In regard to factors affecting Money Supply, a few adjustments have been made as a result of the wider coverage. In the item net RBI credit to Government, a minor adjustment has been made in the new series, with regard to investments in foreign securities such as IBRD shares, Commonwealth bonds and deposits with German Postal Organisation held in investment account of the Banking department of the Reserve Bank of India for accounting reasons. This is shown in the new series as deduction from 'total investments' and is included in foreign exchange assets of RBI. The investments of Central Co-operative Banks, Urban Co-operative Banks and Salary Earners' Societies in Central and State Government Securities are also taken into account while compiling other bank's credit to Government in the revised series.

In regard to item net foreign exchange assets of the banking sector, as mentioned above, the major change brought about in the new series is that the amount of foreign securities which is being held under Investment account and hence hitherto formed part of net RBI credit to Government is segregated

and included in foreign assets of the RBI. Besides, quota subscription and some other payments to the International Monetary Fund in rupees credited to IMF account No. 1 are not netted against total foreign assets since there will be no corresponding rise in foreign assets. These quota and other payments are now included in non-monetary liabilities of RBI.

Time deposits with banks comprises Scheduled and Non-Scheduled commercial banks, State Co-operative banks, Central Co-operative banks and Primary Co-operative banks.

Net Non-monetary Liabilities of RBI comprises :

- (i) the sum of capital and reserves,
- (ii) contribution by the Reserve Bank to the National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations and Stabilisation) Funds and National Industrial Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund,
- (iii) the difference of—
 - (a) other liabilities of the Reserve Bank (mainly bills payable, profits of the Bank accruing under various heads such as interest, discount, exchange, commission, etc.) and
 - (b) other assets (mainly premises, furniture, fittings, stationery, debit balances under heads representing expenditure incurred by the Reserve Bank and items in course of collection, etc.),
- (iv) Reserve Bank Employees' Pension Fund, Provident Fund and Co-operative Guarantee Fund,
- (v) An offset of Rs. 43 crores to assets held against Indian currency returned by Pakistan awaiting adjustment,
- (vi) the amounts collected under Additional Emoluments (Compulsory Depo-

sit) Act, 1974 and the Compulsory Deposit Scheme (Income-tax payers) Act, 1974 since 16th August 1974 and 13th December 1974, respectively and

- (vii) a portion of India's IMF quota and other payments held in IMF A/c. No. 1.

Other Net Non-monetary Liabilities of Banks (derived) comprises mainly capital and reserves of banks and the difference of their

- (a) other liabilities (mainly bills payable and net credit balances on account of branch adjustments) and
- (b) other assets (mainly premises, furniture, fittings, net debit balances on account of branch adjustments and capitalised expenses and tangible assets like uncleared cheques, stamps in hand, etc.) and errors and omissions.

For further details about the concepts and compilation of the new series, reference may be made to 'Money Supply in India—Concepts, Compilation and Analysis—Report of the Second Working Group, Reserve Bank of India, Bombay, 1977', also published in the January 1977, issue of RBI Bulletin.

Statement 30 :

The item 'Other liabilities' includes :

- (i) paid-up capital of Rs. 5 crores and
- (ii) reserve fund of Rs. 80 crores upto January 31, 1969 and Rs. 150 crores thereafter, the increase representing mainly the profit on revaluation of the Bank's gold stocks, effected from February 1, 1969 in terms of the amendment to Section 33(4) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934. Also included in 'Other liabilities' are the balances in (a) National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.A.C. (L.T.O.) Fund], (b) National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund [N.A.C. (Stab.) Fund] and (c) National Industrial Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund [N.I.C. (L.T.O.)

Fund] on respective dates as given below :

Statement 31 :

Details of the interest rates under different categories of financing according to purpose, are given below :

Seasonal agricultural operations : At 2% below Bank Rate upto 1972-73. For 1973-74 and 1974-75, at ½% below Bank Rate subject to rebate of 1½% as per the Linking Scheme. From 1975-76 at 2% below Bank Rate subject to recovery of additional interest of 1½% as per the Linking Scheme, excepting under Section 17(4)(a) of the RBI Act for which the interest rate continued to be at 2% below Bank Rate.

Marketing of crops including cotton and kapas and to co-operative sugar factories against stocks of sugar : At 2% below Bank Rate upto 1973-74 and at 3% above Bank Rate from 1974-75.

Purchase and distribution of chemical fertilizers : At Bank Rate upto 1971. For 1972 and 1973, at 2% above Bank Rate and 3% above Bank Rate from calendar year 1974.

Production and marketing activities of handloom weavers' societies, conversion of short-term into medium-term loan out of National Agricultural Credit (Stabilisation) Fund and medium-term loans for agricultural purposes : At 1½% below Bank Rate.

Long-term loans to State Governments for contribution to the share capital of Co-operative Credit Societies : No interest for the first two years, 2% for the next three years, 2½%

for the next four years and 3% for the next three years, on the outstandings of the advances made up to March 31, 1974. From April 1, 1974, a uniform rate of 6 per cent is charged on fresh loans.

Purchase of rural debentures of land development banks (amounting to Rs. 83 lakhs in 1972-73) : Rs. 45 lakhs at 5¼ per cent and Rs. 38 lakhs at 5 per cent.

Purchase of ordinary debentures of land development banks (amounting to Rs. 276 lakhs in 1972-73) : Rs. 124 lakhs at 5¾ per cent and Rs 152 lakhs at 6 per cent.

Statement 32 :

Consequent on the merger of the Refinance Corporation for Industry with Industrial Development Bank of India on September 1, 1964, the shares of the paid-up value of Rs. 100 lakhs, held by the Reserve Bank of India, have been paid for and taken up by the Industrial Development Bank of India.

Outstandings in respect of short-term finance to Industrial Finance Corporation under Section 17(4B) (a) and to Industrial Development Bank of India under Section 17 (4H) (a) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 are 'nil'. Consequent upon the coming into force of the Public Financial Institutions Laws (Amendment) Act, 1975, share holdings of the Reserve Bank of India in all the SFCs and IDBI have been transferred to and vested in IDBI and Government of India respectively, from February 16, 1976.

The item 'Others' under Industrial Development Bank of India relates to long-term finance to IDBI from the NIC (LTO) Fund for purposes of purchase of or subscription to stocks, shares, bonds, debentures issued by IFC, SFCs or any other notified financial institution or for purposes of any other business of IDBI.

Statement 42 :

(a) The Reserve Bank of India Rate (Bank Rate) was raised from 5 to 6 per cent

on January 9, 1971, to 7 per cent on May 31, 1973 and to 9 per cent from July 23, 1974.

(b) Treasury bill rate of discount for sales on tap was raised from 3.00 per cent to 3.50 per cent from January 9, 1971, to 4.00 per cent from June 1, 1973, to 4.25 per cent from April 1, 1974 and to 4.60 per cent from July 23, 1974.

(c) (i) The call money rates are the weighted averages of the quotations, the weights being proportional to the amounts accepted during the period. (ii) As a follow up of the Reserve Bank's decision to fix the maximum lending rate charged by commercial banks at 16.5 per cent effective March 15, 1976, the Indian Banks' Association issued a directive to its members asking them not to demand or pay more than 12.5 per cent per annum on any inter-bank borrowing with effect from March 29, 1976. Following the changes made by the Reserve Bank in the interest rate structure of banks, the Indian Banks' Association also revised the ceiling rate on inter-bank call money transactions to 10.0 per cent with effect from June 15, 1977.

(d) Deposit rates are for major Indian banks having demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores and above and for foreign banks. These rates were based on Inter-Bank Agreement upto September 1964 and on the Reserve Bank directives thereafter.

(e)(i) In terms of the Reserve Bank's directive dated October 2, 1975 the Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) were permitted to pay interest higher by 0.5 per cent per annum on deposits accepted by them than those prescribed for specified categories of deposits for periods upto 5 years. This was further amended to cover the deposits with a maturity of more than 5 years also, with effect from January 1, 1977. Following the change in the interest rate structure with effect from June 1, 1977, the Regional Rural Banks are allowed to continue to pay 0.5 per cent more on savings and fixed deposits, except in the case of deposits above five years.

(ii) Similarly, the scheduled commercial banks with demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores are allowed to continue to pay an additional interest of 0.25 per cent per annum, at their discretion, on all savings deposits and on term deposits upto and inclusive of 5 years. The rate of interest for deposits above 5 years continued to be at 10 per cent. As regards savings deposit accounts, distinction has been drawn between savings bank accounts with and without cheque facilities. Deposits in the savings deposit accounts without cheque facilities will be paid an interest of 5 per cent per annum and those with cheque facilities 3 per cent per annum with effect from July 1, 1977.

(f) With effect from February 1, 1975, the smaller banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores were allowed to pay 0.25 per cent higher on their term deposits with maturity of 5 years and less. For savings deposits, the rate was 5.25 per cent for banks with liabilities of Rs. 10-25 crores and 5.50 per cent for banks with liabilities of less than Rs. 10 crores. However, with effect from June 1, 1977, all banks with demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores, are allowed to pay at their discretion, additional interest of 0.25 per cent per annum on all savings deposits and on term deposits upto and inclusive of 5 years.

(g) A ceiling of 9 per cent was imposed on the lending rates of the Indian scheduled banks with aggregate demand and time liabilities of Rs. 50 crores or above and all the foreign scheduled banks with effect from September 25, 1964; the rate was raised to 10 per cent from February 17, 1965, but reduced to 9.50 per cent from March 2, 1968. Since January 21, 1970, the ceiling on lending rates was withdrawn.

(h) With effect from March 15, 1976, the Bank fixed the maximum lending rate to be charged by scheduled commercial banks having demand and time liabilities of over Rs. 50 crores at 16.5 per cent. Banks with demand and time liabilities between Rs. 25 crores and Rs. 50 crores were allowed to

charge one percentage point higher than the ceiling rate of interest (i.e. 17.5 per cent). The rate is inclusive of the 7 per cent levy on interest income from advances. The ceiling rate will not apply to banks with demand and time liabilities of less than Rs. 25 crores.

Statement 45:

Under the Credit Guarantee Scheme, which is administered by the Reserve Bank of India as agent of the Central Government, all receipts by way of guarantee fees, recoveries in claim paid accounts, etc. less all payments by way of claims, are transmitted to Government as at the end of June and December each year. The net surplus with the Government represents the net amount (cumulative) transferred to Government. The entire administrative expenditure of the Guarantee Organisation is borne by the Reserve Bank of India.

Under the Scheme, as modified from February 1, 1970, (when the number of Guarantees outstanding was 92,755) and in terms of the agreement between the bank/financial institution and the Guarantee Organisation, all eligible credit facilities to small-scale units are deemed as covered and the issue of Guarantee certificates in respect of individual credit facilities having been dispensed with, they are required to file quarterly returns reporting such eligible credit facilities.

Advances under Default : As soon as a default occurs in an account, the credit institution is required to report it to the Guarantee Organisation and the guarantee may be invoked any time thereafter. Such accounts, therefore, are potential claims.

Statement 46:

Debt : Comprises (1) all borrowings from Government and semi-Government Statutory Financial Corporations and other institutional agencies, (2) borrowings from banks against (i) other mortgages and (ii) own debentures and (3) "Other borrowings" against (i) own debentures, (ii) other mort-

gages, (iii) deferred payment liabilities and (iv) public and other deposits.

Equity : is the same as *Net worth*, explained in the statement.

Current assets : Comprise (1) inventories, (2) loans and advances and other debtor balances, (3) book value of quoted investments, (4) cash and bank balances and (5) advance of income-tax in excess of tax-provision.

Current liabilities : Comprise (1) tax-provisions in excess of advance of income-tax and other current provisions, (2) borrowings less debt as defined above and (3) trade dues and other current liabilities.

Statements 70 to 72:

The figures for Revenue and Capital accounts given in statements 70 to 72 are not comparable with those given in the Reports on Currency and Finance prior to 1973-74 due to changes in the accounting classification of the Budget. For a brief discussion on the new classification, please refer to Chapter V on "Budgets and Public Debt" of the Report on Currency and Finance for 1973-74.

Statement 72:

The figures of total revenue and expenditure as given in this statement differ from those in the Budget papers because (a) receipts from forests, opium, currency and mint, electricity, etc., are shown on a net basis and (b) State's share of Union excise duties and additional duties of excise is excluded. Budget estimates for 1977-78 relate to those presented to the Lok Sabha in June 1977.

Data from 1973-74 onwards cover expenditure on food subsidy under the head "Agriculture and allied services" as part of economic services and relief on account of natural calamities as part of "social and community services" under developmental expenditure; in earlier years, data on the

expenditure on these items was included under the head "other expenditure" as part of non-developmental expenditure.

Statement 81 :

Outstanding balances of debt and other liabilities of the Government of India as presented in this statement differ from those published in the Bank's Reports on Currency & Finance prior to 1974-75. The difference reflects partly changes in the sources of data, but mainly the inclusion of some heads in the statement which were not covered earlier.

Statements published in earlier Reports were compiled from three sources, viz., Finance Accounts of the Union Government, Combined Finance and Revenue Accounts of the Union and State Governments and the Explanatory Memoranda on the Budgets of the Central Government. The data presented in this statement are drawn from the Finance Accounts of the Union Government for the period end-March 1971 to end-March 1975, data for end-March 1976 are obtained from the Ministry of Finance, Government of India and data for end-March 1977 and end-March 1978 are drawn from the Explanatory Memorandum on the Budget of the Central Government for 1977-78 as the Finance Accounts are not available for these years.

The main difference between the present statement and the statements prior to 1974-75 pertains to 'Reserve Funds and Deposits', outstanding balances against which are uniformly higher than the corresponding balances in the earlier statements. This is largely due to the inclusion under this item in the present statement of balances at credit of Reserve Funds not bearing interest; these balances were not covered earlier.

Statement 82 :

The statement is prepared from the information given in the Finance Accounts of the Union Government and the Explanatory

Memorandum on the Budget of the Central Government. In the memoranda on Central Budgets prior to 1976-77, data on certain items like capital outlay on important departmental undertakings and investment in major autonomous corporations were separately shown and data on External Debt were shown country-wise and institution-wise, whereas from 1976-77 onwards these items are clubbed together and not shown separately by corporation/institution/or country division. Consequent modifications have been made in this statement since the Report on Currency and Finance for 1975-76.

Statement 84 :

State debt has been re-classified as recommended in the Second Report of the Team on Reforms in the Structure of Budget and Accounts. Outstanding debt liabilities from March 31, 1973 onwards presented in this statement are, therefore, not strictly comparable, item by item, with those for the earlier period. Earlier the total debt of State Governments used to be shown under the following heads : (i) Permanent Debt, (ii) Floating Debt, (iii) Loans from the Centre, (iv) Other Debt and (v) Unfunded Debt. Under the new classification the major heads are : (i) Internal Debt, (ii) Loans and Advances from the Central Government and (iii) Provident Funds, etc.

Market loans and bonds : This item is identical with the item 'Permanent Debt' in the old classification and comprises current and expired loans floated on the market and bonds issued in connection with abolition of Zamindari and Jagirdari and housing bonds, etc.

Ways and Means Advances from the Reserve Bank of India : This item corresponds to 'Floating Debt', of the earlier classification except for the exclusion of cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, and represents in the new classification ways and means advances and overdrafts (repayable within

seven days) from the Reserve Bank of India. Figures in the statement against this item upto March 31, 1972, represent outstanding 'Floating Debt', of the old classification and are thus not strictly comparable with those for the subsequent period.

Loans from Banks and Other Institutions: This item corresponds to 'Other Debt' of the earlier classification, but includes cash credits from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks not covered in 'Other Debt' and represents loans from the State Bank of India and other commercial banks, National Agricultural Credit (Long-Term Operations) Fund of the Reserve Bank of India, National Co-operative Development Corporation, Life Insurance Corporation of India, Employees' State Insurance Corporation, Khadi and Village Industries Commission, etc. Figures against this item upto March 31, 1972 represent outstanding 'Other Debt' under the old classification and are, therefore, not strictly comparable with those for the subsequent period.

Loans and Advances from the Central Government: This item is identical with 'Loans from the Centre' in the earlier classification and comprises loans and advances from the Central Government for plan as well as non-plan purposes including loans against small savings collections.

Provident Funds, etc.: This item is identical with 'Unfunded Debt' of the old classification and includes State Provident Funds, Insurance and Pension Funds, Trusts and Endowments, etc.

Statements 85 and 86 :

The statements exclude :

(i) the National Defence Gold Bonds 1980 (A and B series) which were on sale between October 1965 and May 1966. The contributions in gold to these bonds were 83,35,260 grams and 47,57,709 grams for

A and B series, respectively. The value of such bonds amounted to Rs. 441 lakhs and Rs. 255 lakhs respectively, at the rate of Rs. 53.58 per 10 grams.

(ii) 4½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1979, 5½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1999, 4½% Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds 1981 and 5¾% Bonds 1985 (Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Ordinance 1975, now Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Act, 1976).

(iii) Rs. 100 crores of *ad-hoc* Treasury Bills funded during 1976-77.

(iv) Issue and repayments of various State Government's Zamindari Abolition and Compensation Bonds which amounted to Rs. 383 lakhs and Rs. 468 lakhs, respectively during 1976-77.

(v) Repayment of Small Savings Certificates and Bonds amounting to Rs. 867 lakhs during 1976-77.

Statement 89 :

The statement on Government of India Loans also includes (i) Hyderabad Loans upto 1974, (ii) 7% (6½% prior to April 1, 1965) Gold Bonds 1977, issued from November 12, 1962, (iii) 7% Gold Bonds 1980, issued from March 2, 1965, (iv) National Defence Gold Bonds 1980, (A and B series) issued between October 1965 and May 1966, in form of Gold, (v) 4½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1979, (vi) 5½% Banks (Acquisition and Transfer) Compensation Bonds 1999, (vii) 4½% Jayanti Shipping Company (Acquisition of Shares) Compensation Bonds 1981 and (viii) 5¾% Bonds 1985, (Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Ordinance 1975, now Voluntary Disclosure of Income and Wealth Act, 1976).

Statement 93 :

The presentation of data in this statement differs from statement 84 in last year's Report in the following manner :

(1) Total Receipts are arrived at by adding 'Other Receipts' such as surcharge from passengers and receipts from subsidised companies to Gross Traffic Receipts.

(2) Under Total Expenditure :

(a) the item 'Other Miscellaneous Expenses' represents the gross miscellaneous expenses unlike net miscellaneous expenses presented in the earlier years and

(b) 'Appropriation to Pension Funds' include the provision for pension funds of other miscellaneous Establishments like Railway Board and the Research, Design and Standards Organisation.

Statements 94 to 100 :

The foreign trade data relate to total sea, air and land trade, on private and Government accounts. With effect from April 1963, trade of Goa, Daman and Diu as well as Andaman and Nicobar Islands, land-borne trade with Nepal and exports by parcel-post of pearls and precious stones are included. Direct transit trade, transshipment trade, ships' stores and passengers' baggage are excluded. Data include silver (other than current coins) notes and coins withdrawn from circulation or not yet issued, indirect transit trade and trade by parcel-post. Exports include re-exports and exports by letter-post. Imports include dutiable articles by letter-post and defence stores and exclude certain consignments of foodgrains and stores on Government account awaiting adjustment. Imports and Exports are based on general system of recording; imports are on c.i.f. basis and exports on f.o.b. basis inclusive of export duty. The exports figures for the period November 1970 to March 1973 are based on original copy of the ship-

ping bills and for the rest of the period they are based on the finally passed shipping bills.

Total figures shown in statements 94 to 97 take into account recent revisions for which detailed breakdowns are not available. Revisions in the total figures are carried out by D.G.C.I. & S. as and when further details become available. Commodity-wise totals in statement 100 may not agree with corresponding figures in statement 95 as the latter are revised subsequently. From April 1965, data are based on the Revised Indian Trade Classification (with amendments upto April 1972) except in the case of imports of (i) 'prescribed substances' under the Atomic Energy Act, 1962 and (ii) 'Petroleum and Petroleum Products'.

Statement 122 :

From 1970-71 to 1974-75, the figures are inclusive of gold from following gold accounts : Surplus Gold Stock Account, gold held at I.M.F. rate (confiscated gold received from State Governments, etc.), confiscated gold received from Customs and Central Excise authorities, National Defence Fund Gold Stock Account, Indian (Bharat) Mines Gold Stock Account, Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account, gold received from Hutti Gold Mines and gold received from public for refining. From 1975-76 data pertain to Surplus Gold Stock (Amalgamated) Account, Confiscated Gold Stock Account (received from Customs and Central Excise authorities), Reserve Bank of India (Issue Department) Gold Stock Account and gold received from Hutti Gold Mines and public for refining.

The figures of silver melting and assaying are inclusive of silver from Surplus Silver Stock Account, confiscated silver received from the Customs and Central Excise authorities, silver received from State Governments and Judicial authorities, silver pertaining to the National Defence Fund and silver received from private parties, etc.
